## **From the Editor**

Greetings Everyone... Warning Rant to Follow...

After much consideration I have decided to strip the Heartbeat down to the bare basics. It seems that few people wish to tackle the forms involved to submit an article, photo or piece of artwork to the newsletter.

While I understand that there is a need to protect copyrighted material and people's privacy, I must admit, gone are the simple days when someone could send me an original article, a photograph from an event or a piece of their artwork and I could put it into print without first receiving a stack of forms. Even if I know everyone is ok with the photo being printed and that the person who gave me the article did it themselves, we just can't take people's word for it anymore.

I have seen the potential for abuse. Many times I have told someone that they can't submit something where they cut and pasted from an article they got off the internet or from a great book they read. As an editor it is important for you to be aware of problems and do what is necessary to avoid bad situations.

Still, as I look through past newsletters I can't help be envious of days gone past when you could find a piece on how to sew Byzantine garb, what White Court was like that year or what dishes would be great at the Yule event, interspersed with pictures of the event and shots of the new garb someone created.

This reminds me of a number of conversations I've had with people lately. Consistently I am hearing how the accumulating number of regulations and paperwork have just sucked the fun right out of the whole SCA experience. I have heard how people miss the many spontaneous types of fun that now require forms and or marshals (if they are even available in your area) to participate in; if you are even allowed to do them at all...

It isn't just the SCA that has been hit by the bubble wrap police, but it seems to bother them more, since they were often drawn to the Society because they are rebels at heart and just wanted a place to escape the overly regulated and litigious real world.

If we want to increase our declining numbers then maybe we should look to the real trend of the future, which is to get back to a simpler existence while maintaining a global community that shares information. People no longer want to do what is "politically correct", they want to celebrate and accept our differences. Technology will be used to simplify, not complicate our lives and in the future, it seems conspicuous consumption will be out and frugality in. This is not just a dream, it is a physical reality for a changing planet.

We in the SCA have access to skills that can be an asset in a world where simpler is better. We have a community where people have the ability to think outside the box, when they allow themselves to. We have the ability to appeal to families who want to do something that doesn't involve a massive

amount of money to participate in. We have a place where men and women can work out their access energy in physical combat. We have a group where you have a thousand years of fashion history to pick and choose your clothes from. And we have a place where you can learn skills to help you learn sustainability.

Perhaps it is time to rethink our approach here. If the future is a global community where information is shared, then maybe we should be seeking a way we can evolve towards that, instead of making it more difficult to do so. If the trend is to embrace our differences then maybe we should stop trying to fit in and celebrate the fact we are not like everyone else.
