The joy of seeing one another and participating in the dream of the SCA is long awaited. It is difficult to navigate these times of trial, not knowing if it's safe to attend, if the health of our loved ones are at risk, or even WHAT the health policy is going to be (it seems to change every few days). The decision we make MUST be our own, without undo pressure or influence from outside our families, and whatever the decision, be confident that you are making the right decision for your family.

Outside of the SCA there is much conflict over vaccination or no-vaccination; mask or no mask. #### A NEW EVENTING EXPERIENCE

After having limited contact with the outside world for what seems too long, I attended an SCA event. It felt challenging. Part of my concern was personal, with health issues that could make me especially vulnerable. However, I was more concerned that I might pick up something unwanted that could affect the health of a few people I still see without safeguards.

Once I calculated that I would be past the two to three week waiting period after the second vaccination by the date of the event, I looked at logistics of the event itself.

- 1. Stay overnight or not? A longer stay increases both length of time and proximity of other people. Would a day-trip feed my soul, seeing other humans in the flesh? Probably yes.
- 2. Travel on my own or ride-share? The cost of gas had conveniently risen, and there was the issue of stopping at stations that may or may not have Covid-19 protocols in place. Fortunately, there were others who were of similar mind, and we conspired to travel together, being that we all were fully vaccinated and were willing to be masked for the time in the car.
- 3. What to bring? Carpooling does have its limits in terms of space. However, not needing camping gear was helpful, and I decided to focus on merchanting; happily, there was enough space for my goods, and another friend provided shelter and company. We each packed our own food and drink.

The day itself was lovely, sunny and just the right temperature! When we arrived on site, we stopped outside the Gate for the usual "interview" of current status of health, travel outside the country, contact with others who are or could be infected with the Covid-19 virus, etc. Yay! We all passed with flying colors!

Then to Gate to sign in and pay our site fee, and learn about the protocols of the site. There were a multiplicity of hand-sanitizer bottles were everywhere, and the biffies were well -stocked with all the things needed to kill things that ought not to be there. Kudos for that!

The archery range was well set with protocols, including no sharing of gear, or else thorough sanitizing between loans. I suspect that was true in other areas, as well.

I noticed that people tended to wear their masks when close to others. I send the warmest of hugs to all who did so! People in masks tended to enunciate well, to be understood, and were very good in using their eyes to convey smiles and kindness. People were also very good about not crowding, and not giving unasked-for hugs. Just having the space to "allow the winds of heaven to blow" between us was a blessing.

In the end, it was a great event, with people respecting space and acknowledging that we are helping each other as a community to stay in contact and to stay healthy. For this, I thank you.

For your information, I have used #staySMART on occasion. This comes from the "Nerdy Girls" (self-applied) at the Facebook page called 'Dear Pandemic'. On #StaySMART, here is what that acronym means:

- S Space: 6 feet or more (that's 2 m for Canadians).
- M Mask: Keep it on. Wear it correctly over nose and mouth.
- A Airflow: Stay outside or in well-ventilated indoor spaces
- R Restrict: Keep your circle of contacts small. Remember that circles are a Venn diagram, and your circle includes all those people who are in your circle members' circles.
- T Time: Keep it short. Less viral load is good.

They didn't include hand-washing, and avoiding touching your face in the list; though they encourage both, I suspect it didn't fit into the acronym, or they expect people are doing that anyway.

With care, we can still attend events, and get through this troubling time... if we #staySMART!

# HARTWOOD ARCHERY FORESTER'S PRACTICE

The early Latin treatise De Arte Bersandi, attributed to a German knight, Guicennas, lists the abilities necessary in a hunter:

- he must know how to shoot well with the bow,
- to train his scenting hound,
- to stand properly by his tree,
- to cut arrow shafts,
- to be handy with the crossbow,
- to make a bowstring,
- to direct his scenting hound,
- to sound a horn.

(The art of medieval hunting: the hound and the hawk by John Cumins. Pg: 47)

In the Shire of Hartwood we have a single day archery practice which begins with a potluck breakfast and a day of shooting. Using the above treatise as a guide the Hartwood foresters must do the following:

- shoot a 30 royal round with a longbow,
- shoot a 25 royal round with a crossbow,
- successfully shoot a moving deer target,
- stand safely by your tree when shooting,
- identify the three types of hounds used in hunting,
- identify the three styles of hunting,
- demonstrate how to make a bowstring: either loop or Flemish twist,
- demonstrate how to make and arrow or bolt
- sound the hunting horn to call the hunters.

Archers will need to meet the royal round requirements within two rounds. The only absolute fail during the day would be standing safely by your tree.

All will be explained before the practice and many times on the day of. No worries as it is all in fun. At least until I have to sound the horn.
