

## A GRETE PYE

serves 6-8

No Christmas feast in medieval times was complete without a 'grete pye'. In Some recipes, it could contain many varied meats, but quite often only two or three different kinds were suggested; change the meats suggested here if you wish.

- 450g/1lb shortcrust pastry
- 1 egg white, beaten until liquid
- 450g/llb boned breast of chicken, pigeon or wild duck and/or saddle of hare or rabbit (not stewing meat)
- Salt and black pepper
- 450g/11b minced beef
- 2 tbsp shredded suet
- 3 hard-boiled egg yolks, crumbled
- ullet Spice mixture made with: 1/4 tsp each ground cinnamon and mace and a pinch of ground cloves
- 25g/loz stoned cooking dates, chopped
- 25g/loz currants
- 50g/2oz stoned prunes, soaked and drained
- 125ml/4fl oz/1/2 cup beef stock
- 1tbsp rice flour or cornflour

Use just over half the pastry to lien a 23-cm/9-inch pie plate. Brush the inside with some of the egg white.

Skin the pieces of breast and the other meat if necessary and parboil them gently in salted water for 10–15 minutes. Drain and leave to cool. Mix together in a bowl the minced beef, suet, salt and pepper to taste, the egg yolks and half the spice mixture. Add the rest of the spices to the dried fruit in another bowl. Slice the parboiled meat. Pre-heat the oven to 220°C/425°F/Gas Mark 7.

Add 1 or 2 tablespoons of the beef stock to the rice flour or cornflour in a small saucepan and cream them together; then add the remaining stock and stir over gentle heat until slightly thickened. Keep aside.

Cover the bottom of the pastry case with half the mince mixture. Arrange the sliced meat in a flat layer on top. Scatter the chopped spiced fruit over it and cover with the remaining mince. Pour the thickened stock over the lot.

Roll out the remaining pastry into a round to make a lid for the pie. Brush the rim of the case with a little more egg white and cover with the lid. Press the edges to seal, and make escape slits for steam. Decorate with the pastry trimmings and glaze with egg white. Bake for 15 minutes, then reduce the heat to  $160^{\circ}\text{C}/325^{\circ}\text{F}/\text{Gas}$  Mark 3 and bake for 45–50 minutes longer.

## **&** Språng Journey Continues

#### Halima al-Rakkasa

If you have read "The Språng Journey of Halima al-Rakkasa" (found at https://athenaeum.baronyofmadrone.net/exhibits/the-sprang-journey-of-halima-al-rakkasa/), then you know this språng topic is a rabbit hole.

This technique requires little in the way of tools, with the manipulation of the warps (thread or yarn) being the main challenge.

#### Tools are:

- something to hold the warps (a wire in-basket from the office; or an embroidery frame; or a picture frame; or the legs of a chair upside down);
- something to hold the ends of the warps in such a way that the tension can be adjusted (a pair of dowels/ chopsticks; or a pair of heavier cords) within the larger frame:
- something like extra yarn or bamboo skewers to control the twist while working;
- latch hook or crochet hook to chain the mid line and/ or the warp ends, off the frame;
- perhaps a long crochet hook or knitting needle to help with the final rows;
- -fingers.

#### Materials are:

- yarn of near any thickness, best if tightly twisted and smooth.

Once the warps are anchored within your frame, the rest is up to your creativity.

For a plain, elastic fabric, interlinking creates a fairly tight mesh for a pouch or a cap; changing the direction of the twist, the braiding action, can create a textured pattern. For something more open, use the same technique, and group the warps for eyelets or a hairnet or a shopping bag.

For a plaid, bias fabric, use two colors, and interlace to create a unique design. It's not quite so elastic as interlinking, yet the bias gives it some stretch. This is again a tighter "weave".



Then there's intertwining! On October 28th of this year, Carol James, a noted textile artist and instructor, taught an online class on sprang intertwining, much like what is seen on the dense caps of Coptic Egypt. The result is much like plain interlinking, but with twining warps running on the diagonal, opening up a new window for design opportunities.

I tend to make pouches and caps from språng, though other garments and furnishings are possible. In this photo, you can see one block of intertwining for a cap of bulky yarn. I have the technique under control, for the most part; calculating final dimensions are a challenge, because you must know the length of the starting warps, which determines the final size when done, different for each technique.

There are still greater levels of complexity in språng technique involving multiple layers, warps that appear and disappear, and more. I appreciate the possibilities ahead of me.




