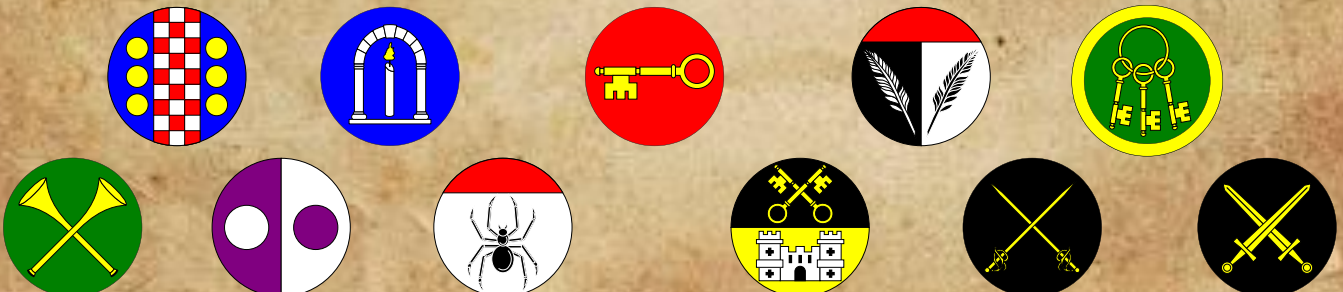

Duties and Responsibilities of the Chatelaine include:

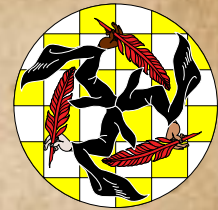
- Performing the office of the Chatelaine as required by directions from Kingdom and/or Principality superior(s).

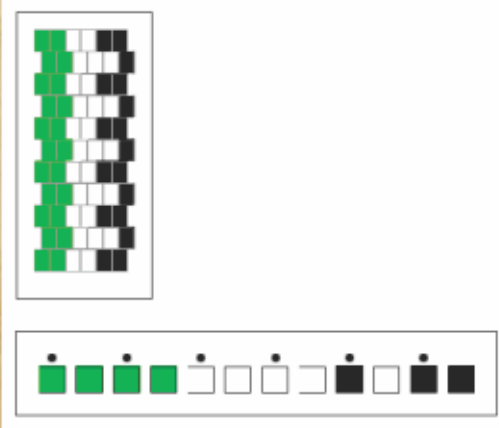
The badge:

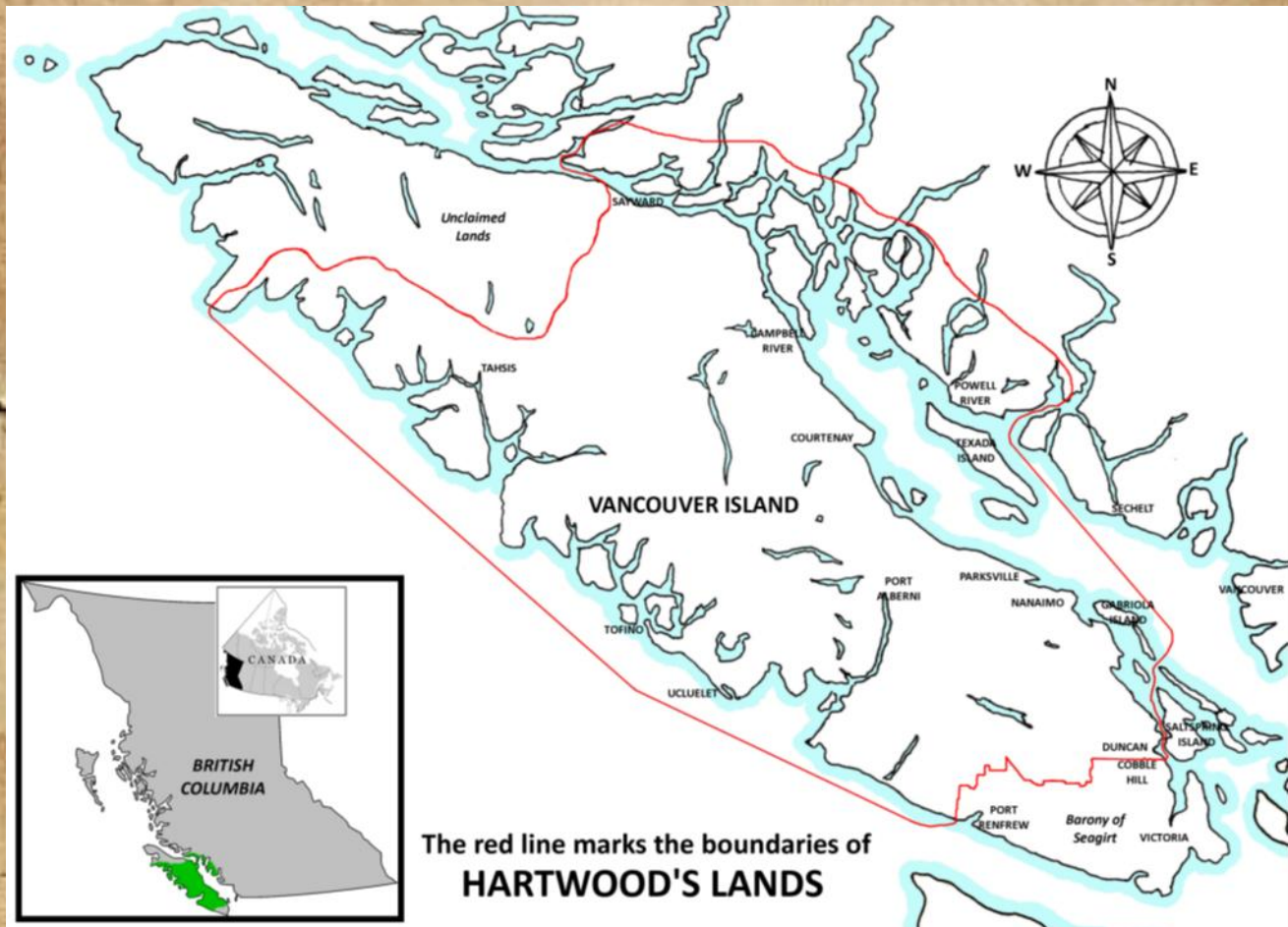

Boundaries!

We have some...

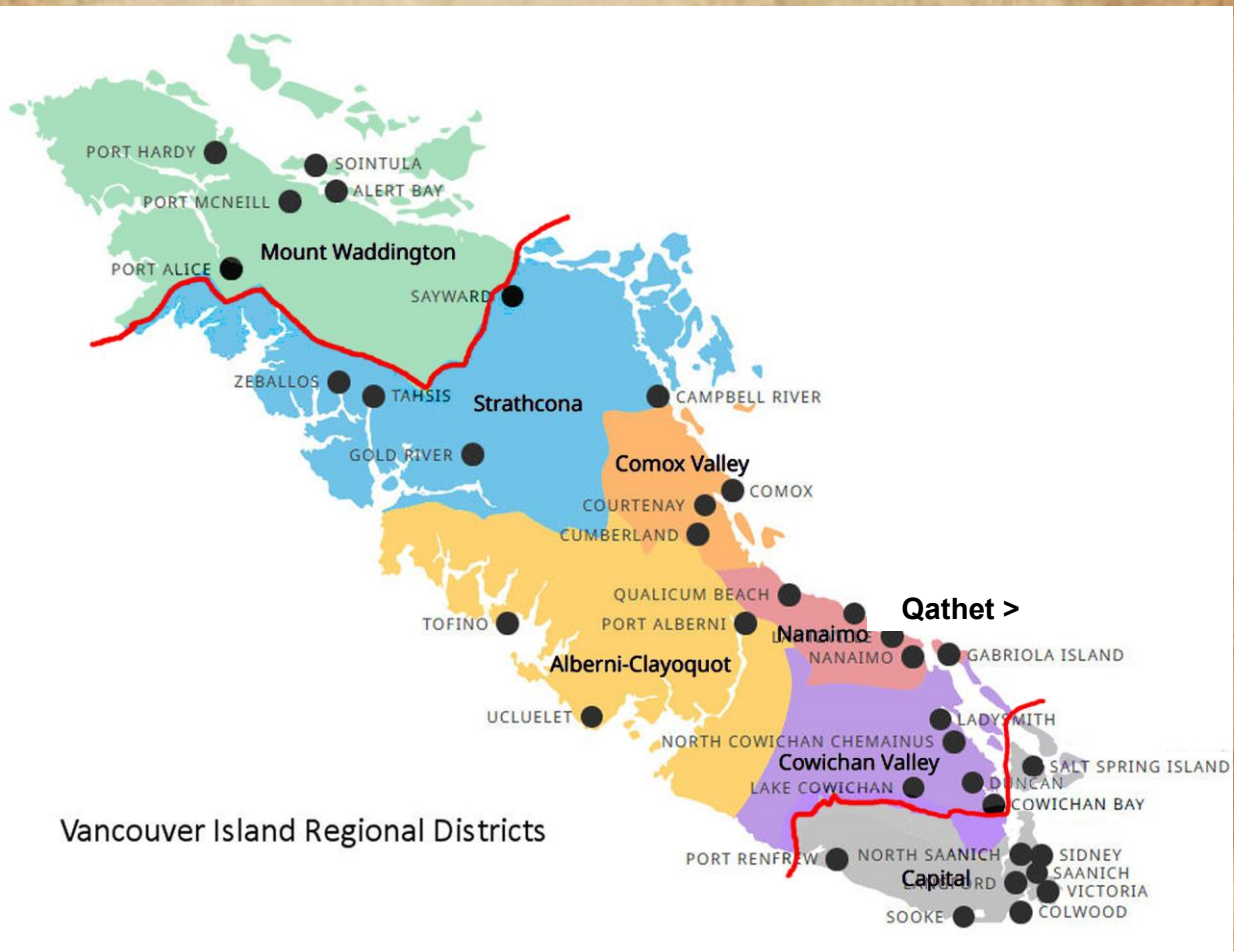
The Shire of Hartwood is on the western edge of the principality of Tir Righ in the kingdom of An Tir. In modern geography, Hartwood is on the coast of British Columbia, Canada as shown in the map below.



Hartwood, once four small shires now combined into a larger stronger branch, encompasses about two thirds of Vancouver Island, British Columbia as well as the neighbouring community of Powell River and islands associated with these areas. The irregular shape of the boundary lines is due to the geography of the island which includes mountains and rivers that limit access into the areas.

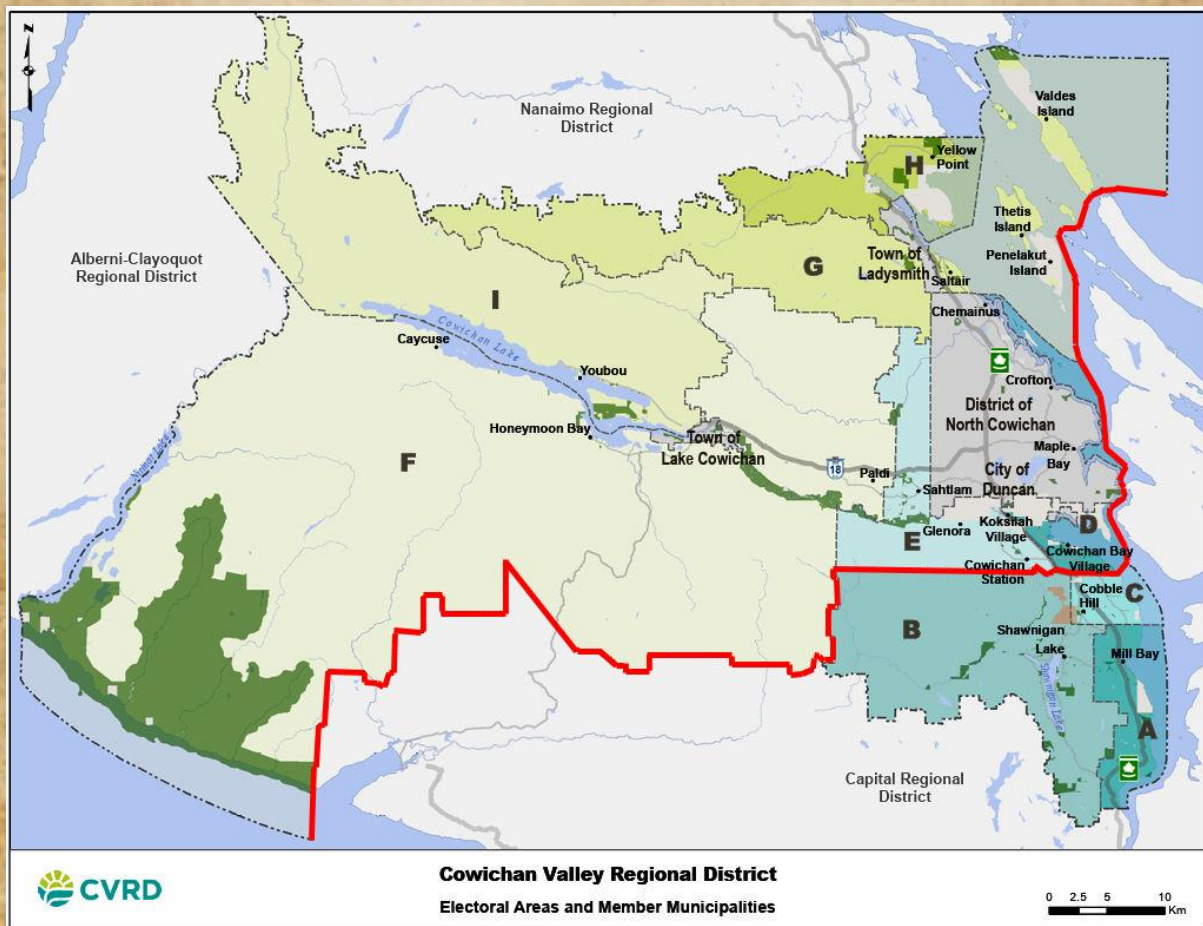
Hartwood's borders primarily follow those of the Regional Districts and include the following (listed roughly from north to south):

- **Strathcona** Regional District which runs on the east coast from Campbell River north to Sayward, over to the west coast of Vancouver Island and includes several of the islands to the east with the main one being Quadra Island;
- **Comox Valley** Regional District which sits below Strathcona RD on the east side of Vancouver Island from south of Campbell River to north of Qualicum Bay with the largest communities being Courtenay and Comox, and includes Denman and Hornby Islands; **Qathet** Regional District (not shown on the following map) is east of the Comox Valley RD, attached to the mainland of BC, and includes Powell River and communities from Lund to Slaty Bay as well as Texada and Lasqueti Islands and a couple smaller islands;
- **Alberni-Clayoquot** Regional District which encompasses a section of the western side and middle of Vancouver Island west of the Comox Valley and Nanaimo RDs with the primary communities being Port Alberni, Tofino, Ucluelet and many smaller communities and islands;
- **Nanaimo** Regional District sits on the east side of Vancouver Island with the main communities being Qualicum Beach, Parksville, Nanaimo, and Gabriola Island but also includes several smaller communities and islands;
- **Cowichan Valley** Regional District is the southernmost of Hartwood's lands and the only one that does not include the entirety of the Regional District as there is a narrow section that runs south into the lands of the Barony of Seagirt. The Cowichan Valley RD sits below the Alberni-Clayoquot and Nanaimo RDs and runs the width of Vancouver Island although the main communities are on the east side. Hartwood's land includes Ladysmith south to Duncan and Cowichan Bay, Valdez, Thetis and Penelakut Islands and a few smaller islands but excludes the lands that fall



into Cowichan Valley's Electoral Areas A, B, and C (communities of Cobble Hill, Mill Bay, Shawnigan Lake and Malahat).

- Hartwood's lands do not include the northernmost part of Vancouver Island which fall in the **Mount Waddington** Regional District and is unclaimed.
- Hartwood's lands also do not include the south end of Vancouver Island which belongs to the Barony of Seagirt whose lands include the **Capital** Regional District that runs west to Port Renfrew and east to Victoria and the Saanich Peninsula as well as Salt Spring and Galiano Islands and several islands south of them. Seagirt's lands also include Cowichan Valley RD's Electoral Areas A, B, and C (Cobble Hill, Mill Bay, Shawnigan Lake and Malahat).
- The map below shows the boundary line (red) between the south end of the Shire of Hartwood and the north end of the Barony of Seagirt.



- Below is a list of the **Postal Codes** that fall within Hartwood's boundaries based on Canada Post's information as of December 2025. Those postal codes with only three characters are municipal areas and include all postal codes starting with those three characters. Those postal codes showing all six characters are rural areas and include **only** those exact postal codes as similar postal codes may exist outside of Hartwood's area and even elsewhere in British Columbia.

Arranging court reports to be completed and entered into minutes of the next meeting for all Shire events. This can be a summary of the Royal Court Report, Event Steward Report, Scribe's Report, Herald's Report, and notes from a responsible surrogate at the event, i.e. a Deputy.

- c. Article 6.3(b)

- i. Original Language:

Following a meeting, the Officials will review the minutes in OneNote within one week; once amendments are made, minutes are considered approved and posted in official publications no later than one week prior to the next council meeting. ii. Changed Language:

Following a meeting, the Officials will review the minutes in OneNote no later than two weeks after the meeting; once amendments are made, minutes are considered approved and posted in official publications no later than one week prior to the next council meeting.

The Financial Committee shall meet every year. ii. Changed Language:

The Financial Committee shall meet, at a minimum, once every year.
